Our Vision for Learning and Teaching is intrinsically linked and embedded in the College's mission, values for learning and pedagogical practices and personal mission. - The complementarity of the two dimensions of Religious Education
- Alignment with the goals of the Brisbane Catholic Education (BCE) *Learning and Teaching Framework*

- Jesus Christ is the centre of this Vision
